GLOSSARY

Bountiful: large in quantity; plentiful

Cobra: a venomous snake from Asia or Africa that expands the skin of its neck

into a hood

Deposits: a collection of minerals in nature (see meaning of minerals)

Diligently: showing great care or determined effort

Foil: to prevent something wrong or undesirable from succeeding

Generations: people born and living during the same time

Graciously: kindly and politely

Lute: a musical instrument that resembles a guitar but has a pear-shaped body

Minerals: a solid substance that is naturally formed by the Earth's processes. It has a particular chemical formula and a crystal structure (for example, turquoise or diamonds)

Rain Forest: a forest with a large amount of rainfall and very tall evergreen trees **Reptiles:** cold-blooded animals that lay eggs and have scaly skin (for example, turtles, snakes, alligators, and lizards)

Sediments: stones or sand left by water, wind, or glaciers

Venomous: having or producing venom, which is poisonous fluid made by an animal
